### SOHOTON COVE NATIONAL PARK IN BUCAS GRANDE ISLAND

It is said that the island is a stunning mix of Boracay, Palawan, Bohol, Tagaytay, and other famous spots. The island is abundant in colorful flora and fauna. ### AGUSANMARSH





### TOP 5 FESTIVALS





#### **Naliyagan Festival**

Dive into the indigenous heritage of Agusan del Sur with this cultural festival! Watch as people celebrate Naliyagan with ancient rituals, an agri-industrial trade fair, an "Agri-lympics," and a great street dance competition to top it off.

**WHEN: June 12-17** WHERE: Agusan del Sur

#### **Bonok-Bonok Festival**

This festival celebrates culture, religion and the indigenous Mamanwa tribes of Suriago. Here, you'll see a multitude of colors as street dancers in costumes fill the roads to display the tribal culture of road moving. That means road parties are up ahead!

WHEN: September 9 **WHERE: Surigao City** 

#### **Balangay Festival**

Before there was even a Philippines, there was Butuan. Transients settled in Butuan on boats they called Balangay/ Balanghai boats. This festival celebrates this event with ten groups in costumes of the social ensembles of that time as they parade and perform through the city.

WHEN: May **WHERE: Butuan City** 

#### Kahimunan Festival

Much like the Sinulog Festival of Cebu, the Kahimunan Festival also gives honor to the city's patron saint, Santo Niño. This festivity is usually celebrated with the usual costumed dancers performing on the streets of the city with a dance competition as well.

**WHEN: First Sunday of January WHERE: Butuan City** 

#### Kaliguan Festival

Similar to the Padigosan Festival of Digos City, Davao, the Kaliguan Festival also pays tribute to Saint John the Baptist. The difference would be in how it is celebrated. The Kaliguan Festival is known for their Perlas ng Kaliguan Pageant along with other shoreline activities.

**WHEN: Last week of June** WHERE: Cagwait, Surigao del Sur
