



CAGAYAN VALLEY REGION

The Cagayan Valley Region is strategically located on the northeastern corner of mainland Luzon.
Its proximity to East Asian countries makes it a natural gateway for trade, investment, and culture.

The region abounds with natural resources and development potential across rich agriculture areas, forest land, and grassy plains, as well as a plentiful bounty of mineral and marine resources.

In fact, this widely undeveloped region accounts for about 9% of total land area in the country!

Cagayan Valley is protected on three sides by mountain ranges, namely the Cordilleras to the west, the Caraballo down south, and the mighty Sierra Madre to the east.

The east coast of the Sierra Madre dips right into the Pacific Ocean while the Bashi Channel borders the region on the north. Inland, the valley is criss-crossed by the longest river in the country, the fresh and plentiful Cagayan River.

Region II is made up of five provinces: the island province of Batanes, the valley provinces of Cagayan and Isabela, and the highland provinces of Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino. These provinces consist of 90 municipalities, four cities, and 2,311 barangays.





BATANES: HOME OF THE WIND

This northernmost province of the Philippines is on the shortlist to become the next UNESCO World Heritage Site. Batanes is a group of islands where you will find:

Home of the Ivatans – Here, women still wear the Vakul, a large and striking wig-like headpiece made from palm fiber that protects from the sun and rain. Men wear a traditional vest called the Kanayi.

Bahay na Bato – or houses of rock that are typhoon-tough, embedded with meter-thick limestone walls and bushy roofs made of indigenous cogon grass. These are built to last centuries even in the worst weather.

Vayang Rolling Hills – Created by nature, preserved over time, the hills are definitely alive in this province.

PALAUIISLAND: UNTOUCHED PARADISE

Found in Santa Ana, Cagayan, this is a protected landscape and seascape managed by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR). Palaui Island was declared a National Marine Reserve with 21 commercial species of fish and over 50 hectares (120 acres) of undisturbed coral reef. This island is in the Top 10 of CNN's list of the World's 100 Best Beaches due to the remarkably raw beauty that extends all the way to the historic Cape Engaño Lighthouse at its northernmost tip.





HONESTY COFFEE SHOP

Witness the honesty system at work! Discover a unique retail experience at the Honesty Coffee Shop, where locals and visitors are trusted to pick up whatever they need and pay the exact amount without having to deal with any cashiers or salespeople. A unique fact about Batanes is that there is virtually zero crime!



MADDELA WATERFALLS

Why visit one waterfall... when you can visit seven! This pristine and peaceful nature retreat in Quirino is home to this incredible seven-staged cascade with a crystal-clear pool perfect for a refreshing dip after your invigorating trek. There's also a picturesque picnic area, so make sure to bring your favorite local food!





CROCODILEISLAND

Don't worry, there are no giant reptiles here! This island was named for its long, tapering shape. Here, visitors can explore amazing rock formations and untouched beaches.

CAPISAANCAVE

The fifth-largest cave system in the country (and one of our best!) can be found in the barangays of Capisaan and Alayan in Kasibu, Nueva Vizcaya. In its depths, you can crawl like a soldier, waddle like a duck, and climb like a tarsier as you make your way through the adventure of a lifetime!




NORTHERN SIERRA MADRE NATURAL PARK

Both the largest protected area in the country with more than 300,000 hectares of rainforest, and the lowest national forest park at 800 feet above sea level. This is the go-to destination for indigenous wildlife in the country, and is in fact among the Top 10 most bio-diverse places in the world–but this untouched paradise is easily accessible from the coastal towns of Isabela like Maconacon and Palanan!
